DIRECTOR'S WELCOME

When James approached me with Scarlet Sunday, I was immediately struck by what a gem of a play this was to direct. Not only is it filled with brilliantly knotty dialogue and complex human emotion, but it is also ripe with vivid imagery. It's quite rare to work on a text where you can directly use art as a focal point and being able to do so was a real privilege. Our designer Cat and I spent some beautiful hours researching different artists and seeing which images we could integrate into the show. Our opening image is a direct nod to Marina Abramović's The Artist is Present as it so overtly opens itself up to different interpretation. Ava and Yasmin's relationship in Scarlet Sunday is constantly shifting as the two circle one another in a delicate dance. James has written a fantastically taut script and it's been a joy working with our performers, Sorcha and Camilla, to draw out these ever-shifting power dynamics.

When James and I first started talking about the play in 2021, the theatre industry was rife with conversation about Chris Goode. Something we noticed at the time was the extent to which people felt they knew him as a person having seen his art. Even within the theatre industry there is a total cultification of artists whose work we admire. I hope that with this play we can raise questions around why we place powerful (more often than not male) artists on pedestals and why it feels like such a personal affront when they abuse their positions of power. James has chosen to explore a deeply complex issue and he's done so with delicacy and nuance. I'm excited to be at a stage where we can share this play with an audience and hear their thoughts!

















WRITING SCARLET SUNDAY

Five years ago, when I first had the idea for the story of *Scarlet Sunday*, our cultural landscape was dominated by revelations about the alleged actions of many celebrities and artists. These revelations were seismic and triggered huge conversations. One of the questions at the root of these conversations was: "Can we separate the art from the artist?" Our relationship with artists and their work was under intense scrutiny. Five years on, we are still scrutinising that relationship, and the waters have only got muddier.

Taking on such an incredibly complex issue was a daunting prospect, but one that felt essential to tackle. I found my way in through exploring the two characters at the heart of the play: Ava and Yasmin. They share a powerful, but very different, relationship with the painting at the heart of the play - Scarlet Sunday - and its creator Ray Blackwood. Teasing out the complicated dance between them allowed me to explore that equally complicated tension between the art we love and the actions of those who create it.

What I love about theatre is that it's an inherently collaborative medium. Since the production process began, the script has gone on its own journey and each member of the creative team - director, dramaturg, actor, designer - brings their own unique vision that shapes, stretches, pulls apart then stitches it back together again. All of these talented people have taken ideas on a page, and they have turned them into something bigger and better than I could ever imagine.

I hope that this piece will contribute to the knotty but vital conversation on how we can better amplify those voices that frequently go unheard.

Frederick Zennor is a visual, performance artist and theatre producer. He is also a freelance actor, director and playwright working across the UK, US and Europe.


